
Better health


Enhanced learning

Smart thing to do!

Giving back 13% annually

Loss of 37% of the adult income


2-3 times greater loss than current health expenditure

Return to investment: 2-18\$

The highest return from investing as early as possible, in disadvantaged families

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT IS A SMART INVESTMENT

The earlier the investment, the greater the return





Less investment in early years


Avg per capita government and donor spending on human capital sectors by age group in ESA, 2019 (in US\$, 2017 constant prices)

The gap is increasing over years


Avg per capita government and donor spending on human capital sectors by age groups in ESA, 2002-19 (in US\$)


Low investment in early years in most countries

Per capita government expenditure in early (0-6) years in ESA, 2019 (in US\$)




Pre-primary, least funded level of education

Huge inequities in access to pre-primary education


Attendance rate in pre-primary education by wealth quintiles in select countries, 2017 or latest (as a % of total)



Key Public Financial Management Issues

Key Issues

- Discrepancy between policy and budget commitments
- Fragmented approaches to ECD budgeting
- Devolution and lack of capacity at decentralized levels
- Budget execution challenges:
 - late approval/disbursement
 - shifting priorities
 - inaccurate forecasting
 - weak controls...

As a result, 66% of children under 5 are at risk of poor developmental outcomes

Poor health

(2.7 million children died before reaching fifth birthday)

Inadequate nutrition

(the number of stunted children rose by 1.4 million)

Lack of early learning opportunities

(7 of 10 children missing ECE)

Lack of support at home

(widespread violent disciplining practices, absence of father's engagement...)





Opportunities for improving ECD Financing (and ECD outcomes)



Opportunities

- Country-specific ECD policies and plans are growing
- Programme performance-based budgeting
- Tools available tools:
 - Measuring and monitoring ECD spending
 - ECD costing



Recommended Actions for Policy Makers

Develop/update	Develop/update national and sectoral ECD plans
Facilitate	Facilitate the costing of ECD plans, across all sector, and increase investment in ECD
Introduce	Introduce program-budgeting
Strengthen	Strengthen the capacity of sub-national and local authorities on ECD planning and budgeting
Strengthen	Strengthen the capacity, quality, and motivation of the ECD workforce
Improve	Improve evidence and use of data
Establish	Establish a transparent system for the ECD budget tracking, allocations, and expenditures
