The Africa Early Childhood Network (AfECN) is a registered non-profit organization, established in 2015 to serve as a platform to champion excellence and collaboration in protecting children's rights, influence policy and practice, strengthen partnerships, and share experiences and knowledge in ECD on the African continent. To achieve this, five priority areas have been identified to help increase the reach and quality of programs and services aimed at building strong foundations for the developmental wellbeing of children. The priority areas are advocacy, networking, improved practice, leadership and research capacity building. Since its establishment, AfECN has made significant strides in its growth, influence and coverage in each of the five priority areas. The network brings together organisations and individuals from civil society, academia, government, and the private sector at national and regional levels organised into working groups that are aimed at nurturing the capacity of individuals and organisations in the thematic areas.

AfECN is holding her inaugural conference with the aim of bringing together ECD public and private interest groups to disseminate evidence and share experiences aimed at enhancing and scaling best practices in Africa. This conference presents an opportunity for networking, engagement, learning, sharing and growth for all the participants.

**AfECN is inviting applications for presentations along the following themes:**

### **Presentation Themes**

Applicants are requested to submit abstracts that are in line with at least one of the conceptual and/or delivery themes outlined below. The conference sub themes are framed from the WHO Nurturing Care Framework.

The key to achievement of SDGs and Agenda 2063 requires a holistic approach to supporting children, families and communities. Equally important are the modalities that support improved services and systems. Presentations will focus on nurturing care thematic areas and/or the underlying modalities and systems that improve service delivery.

### **A. Nurturing Care Themes**

1. *Good health* – health related systems and services that support the needs of young children from conception to age 8 and the physical and mental health of their caregivers. Particular interests include integration of ECD interventions within existing health service delivery systems and maternal mental health.
2. *Good nutrition* – development, delivery and access to adequate nutritional services for young children from conception to age 8 in Africa.
3. *Early learning* – challenges, new ideas and innovation in the development and delivery of quality formal and informal early learning environments. Particular interests include children below 3 years of age and the integration of traditional systems, tools and resources.
4. *Safety and protection* – protection of young children from neglect, violence and maltreatment. Particular interests include children of refugees, and children facing conflict, effects of natural disasters or disease outbreak.
5. *Responsive caregiving* – the dynamic relationship between caregivers and young children from conception to age 8 and it's impact on child outcomes and caregiver's health and well being.

## B. Systems Strengthening Themes

1. *Policy, advocacy and communication* – efforts to align the ECD agenda at the forefront of policy development and implementation in Africa
2. *Capacity building and effective implementation* – skills building and knowledge sharing to strengthen human resources and improving practice through leveraging other interventions and addressing challenges in quality provision of services.
3. *Research, innovation and monitoring and evaluation* – knowledge exchange, skills building, dissemination of novel ideas, including effective use of resources and standardisation of indicators for regional congruence of ECD.
4. *Resource mobilisation and sustainability* – efforts aimed at supporting economic, environmental, and social sustainability of ECD systems and services
5. *Partnership and networking* – collaborative efforts to enhance ECD

## Presentation Categories

Presentations will be accepted for oral and poster presentations, symposia and roundtable discussions, VIDEO DISPLAY/INTERACTIVE SESSION.

## Abstract Submission Guidelines

The abstracts are expected to meet the following writing specifications:

- The abstracts should be written in English times new roman font size 12. They should be between 250-300 words highlighting the following:
  - Introduction/background of the problem
  - Problem statement/rationale
  - Methods/description of intervention
  - Results/Achievements
  - Lessons learned
  - Recommendations for scale up



**Deadline for Abstract Submission:** On/or before 14<sup>th</sup> Augt 2018  
**Deadline for Full Paper Submission:** On/or before 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 2018  
**Deadline for Submission of Posters, Videos, Power point etc:** On 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 2018
