Role of interfaith leaders in influencing policy and implementation of ECD agenda

- Deeper collective understanding of nurturing care components of ECD in relation to the religious teachings.
- Advocate for increased uptake and practice of holistic nurturing care framework components to enhance child survival and optimal development at community levels
- Enhance male and father's engagement for responsive caregiving
- Engage in ECD networks and sector/technical working groups with key opinion leaders at National and county levels.
- Address policy formulation, development, and implementation with key opinion leaders at government level to ensure resource allocation and investment for the benefit of the larger society.

Challenges and solutions of the ECD interfaith Advocacy program

Challenges

- Some religious norms and beliefs are against nurturing care framework
- Interpretation of some religious teachings
- Community change of behavior and attitude
- Program dependent on donor support

Solutions

- Build capacity of the interfaith leaders on nurturing care framework
- Integration of nurturing care components to religious teachings
- Use of existing structures such as congregations, state and non state actors' committees/technical working groups

Conclusion

Lessons learnt

- Capacity building interfaith leaders with knowledge and information on ECD equips them to articulate and voice out pertinent ECD components.
- Increased engagement of interfaith leaders ensures impartial decision making on matters policy with key opinion leaders.

- There has been evidence on the impact of religious leaders on peace and governance,
 Human papillomavirus (HPV) and covid-19 vaccine uptake.
- These findings clearly show that interfaith leaders have a significant impact on advocacy ECD notwithstanding.
